

Context

The Global Parliamentary Forum (GPF) is the flagship parliamentary event at the Spring Meetings of the World Bank Group (WBG) and the International Monetary Fund (IMF), organized jointly by the Parliamentary Network on the World Bank and IMF (PN), the WBG, and IMF. The event gathers approximately 200 legislators from around the world to dialogue with senior leadership from the WBG and IMF as well as global development experts. The highlight of the Forum during Spring Meetings is a townhall with WBG President Ajay Banga and IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva.

The Spring Meetings of the IMF and WBG are annual gatherings that bring together finance ministers, central bank governors, development experts, private sector executives, civil society representatives, parliamentarians and academics to discuss global economic and development issues. In addition to the meetings of the Boards of Governors, the Development Committee (DC) and the International Monetary and Financial Committee (IMFC) meetings takes place. The DC and the IMFC advise the Boards of Governors of both institutions. These meetings play a crucial role in shaping global economic discussions and finding solutions to major development challenges.

Background

Established in 2000, the **Parliamentary Network on the World Bank & IMF (PN)** serves as a neutral platform for parliamentarians from member countries to enhance both accountability and transparency within development cooperation. It empowers parliamentarians to:

- **Share knowledge and experiences** for collective understanding of global challenges and best practices in addressing them.
- **Hold governments and international financial institutions accountable** by fostering dialogue and scrutiny, ensuring development efforts deliver intended outcomes.
- Shape the international development agenda through active participation of parliamentarians in discussions and policy decisions.

Through its diverse membership and events, the PN fosters transparent engagement between parliamentarians, the WBG, and IMF. This exchange of information and feedback accelerates progress and ultimately contributes to achieving effective development goals.

Shaping the Future of AI Governance

Artificial Intelligence (AI) presents a transformative opportunity to revolutionize industries, boost productivity, drive economic growth, and create jobs. However, its rapid advancement also poses a significant risk: exacerbating existing economic inequalities, both within and between nations. While advanced economies may gain substantial advantages, emerging markets and developing economies risk being left behind due to AI infrastructure and skills gaps. Beyond inequality, Al raises critical ethical, accountability, and transparency concerns. Effective Al governance demands a collaborative approach, involving governments, the private sector, international organizations, financial institutions, lawmakers and civil society. This session will explore perspectives from parliamentarians, the WBG, and the IMF on harnessing Al's potential and shaping its future. The session will discuss strategies to maximize Al's benefits while minimizing its risks, ensuring equitable distribution and establishing robust governance frameworks that prioritize safety, fairness, and ethics.

This session explores how these reforms, leveraging indicators, data, Al, and other emerging market-based technologies, can catalyze this process. Parliamentarians and governments, as policy architects, must prioritize an enabling investment climate by crafting legislation that reduces red tape, ensures regulatory clarity, streamlines bureaucratic processes, and establishes predictable fiscal policies. This session will delve into the practical steps these actors can take together: identifying key reform areas within the regulatory landscape and other sectors, designing effective implementation strategies, and fostering an environment that attracts private investment, especially in emerging and low-income developing economies, ultimately leading to sustainable and inclusive growth and boosting productivity.
